I regret that, owing to delays caused by the war, I have been unable to write to you before this about the result of the Hall Scholarship Examination.

On behalf of the Governing Body of this Hall, I have pleasure in offering you an Entrance Scholarship of £15 for the Session 1940-41. The Scholarship would be renewed for the two following Sessions, provided that your work and conduct are satisfactory. The Scholarship would take the form of a reduction in Hall Fees, and its effect would be, to reduce your Hall Fees from £84 to £69 per Session, or from £28 to £23 per Term.

This offer will remain open for seven days, but, if you have special reasons requiring an extension of time, please let me know the full circumstances, and I shall see what can be done. I hope, however, that you will be able to accept the offer at once. If so, will you kindly let me have the Entrance Deposit of £1. This sum will be returned to you by deduction from your first Term's Hall Fees, but it is not returnable in the event of your withdrawing from the Hall before the Session begins.

Dear Mr. Thyer,

I return herewith the letters from the Glamorgan Director of Education which you left with me.

I showed these letters to the Registrar of the University, and gave him also particulars of your family income and circumstances. The Registrar told me that the University of Manchester would allow a man Student, resident in one of the Halls, to hold University Scholarships up to the value of £148 per annum plus Fees. You will see that this figure is well above the total amount that you have received so far.

I think that, if you had gained a State Scholarship here, no contribution would be expected from your parents, as the family income is £275, and as there is one dependent child besides yourself.

These facts confirm what I thought: that you have a strong case for an addition to your grants. I regret very much that you did not take advice from some responsible person before writing to the Director of Education. I know that the Education Authorities are willing to give generous help when there is a real need for it, but you must understand that such bodies have a serious responsibility for the disposal of public money. They will not grant any increase unless a convincing case has been made out in favour of it. I do not think that you have presented your case wisely, but, as I say, I do think that you have a strong case for an increase. I hope that the Glamorgan Authority will let you have a loan, and I suppose that there is even yet the chance that they may review the matter and increase your grant.
